The Handley Rec Center's needs are changing

VISION

We envision the Handley Center as a community hub where it will expand its services to youth while also serving community members on a larger capacity. This center will be a gathering place for to create community safe haven for children, and continue our dedication to overall health and wellness in the community.

PROBLEM

While there is a space for the Boys and Girls Club to reside in the building, they are limited by lack of a kitchen and classroom space. The Handley also has a tremendous amount of underutilized space, simply because it is not renovated and unfit for a classroom or working environment. The Handley also has no space for administrators to conduct the vital operations of the facility. In short, although there is a tremendous amount of space in the current building, operations are limited by the type of interactions, class sizes, additional meeting and educational space to expand their program and meet a great community need.

PLAN

We plan to take the remaining portion of the current building's main level and create a versatile, warm and welcoming space for children and adults. With this renovation, we will be able to open a classroom to contract with Northern Hills Alliance for Children and provide daycare to children ages 3-5 years. We will also be able to install a full commercial kitchen, meeting space, office space, and additional classroom space for the Boys and Girls Club. This transition will allow us to increase the capacity for educational care, cooking space, and meeting space for the community.
